- Inner East Preston the wards of Fishwick and St Matthew's
- Area profile:
 - Population approx. 12,000
 - Approx. 30% area's population of a BME background
 - Predominantly residential with industrial and shopping areas
 - Generally densely built and densely populated
 - This is a low income area which has features associated with 'multiple deprivation'


Decentralisation and Localism Act 2012 – new community powers but

Consultation Outcomes

Key issues raised through consultation:

- Improving road safety and car parking
- Preserving community assets
- Protecting, enhancing & improving green space & play areas
- Addressing dereliction (empty properties, empty shops and 'grot spots')
- Addressing Anti Social Behaviour (fly-tipping, litter, dog fouling)

The Neighbourhood Plan from the lay perspective: Strengths and Challenges

Strengths:

- An established forum representative of the area
- Skilled and committed individuals.
- Support from other voluntary and community groups within the area
- Strong vision and priorities for the area

Challenges:

Neighbourhood Plan can be a difficult concept to understand – explain in a way which makes the plan personal

- Many non-planning issues raised
- Language limitations production of Polish language documents
- Local business involvement
- Loss of confidence previous failed initiatives and negative experiences with Local Authority

Issues, Vision and Objectives

Strengths:

- Involvement of local residents and organisations early in the process
- Identification of main themes relevant for the area for the plan to address
- Created a focus for a series of consultation events – helped to introduce the Neighbourhood Plan to other residents
- Created a slogan: 'Your
 Neighbourhood, Your Views Count'
- Received a good response to the consultation
- Political support locally
- Generating interest nationally

- Forming good relationships between local authority staff and local residents is both essential and possible; develop respect, tolerance, confidentiality and honesty
- Learning to speak the same language is both essential and possible (...well, generally!)
- Achieving resident representation equals finding the holy grail!

Gaining resident support for an official sounding initiative in a deprived area will always be challenging

Lessons from Inner East Preston

- Be realistic about the resources of the residents' group (time/resources/skills) and consider carefully your expectations
- Don't underestimate the amount of local knowledge/history of the area the forum have
- Be flexible and adaptable in the approach to support and advise
- Don't use complex terminology explain processes and guidance clearly
- Address aspirations, be realistic about delivery –
 in an area where many schemes have failed to
 materialise, it is important to be open and honest
 about how the plan will be delivered
- Be patient, and the likelihood is that the result will be very rewarding
