Measuring deprivation by area means looking at the geographical patterns of poverty and resources, which can be used to make policy decisions about what support is needed and where.





CONCEPT EXPLAINER



Area deprivation allows us to look at

02

the places where poverty is concentrated. It does this by using a number of different measurements, some of which consider poverty directly looking at income levels for individuals and families, for example - and others which look at outcomes from experiences of poverty, such as health.

It also includes

measures that look at what resources are available in different areas – whether there are shops, schools, GPs or green spaces, for example.







Describing an area



as being more or less deprived doesn't mean that everyone who lives there will have the same experience, but it does help to target resources where they are most needed.
